yumdb

- What it does: Stores additional and optional data about installed packages.
- Why: we needed a place to put it and we couldn't do it in the rpmdb (at the time)
- How: simple fs-based "db" in /var/lib/yum/yumdb
- What's stored: installed-from-repo, reasonfor-install, commandline of install, etc

yumdb – things to do

- Store change information in notes so an admin can know why something is installed or why this set of pkgs was installed
- Add information for a set of pkgs and make a yum plugin which takes action based on the presence or absence of that information
- Something else entirely :)

yum history

- What: stores and allows actions based on what yum has done in the past.
- How: a sqlite db stores fairly detailed information about what yum is doing, while and immediately following the completion of a transaction.
- Why: Oft-requested feature to undo/revert/explain the set of pkgs which just changed.

yum history

- Commands:
 - List lists history items
 - Summary short summary of a transaction
 - Info detail of a transaction
 - Undo undo what a transaction did
 - Redo/repeat redo what a transaction did
 - New create a new history db, preserving the old one

yum history new

 Nothing to show here. It makes a new sqlite database file in /var/lib/yum/history/ that has a higher date than the previous one.

 If you want to go back to the older one just [re]move the new one and that's it.

yum history - other info

- Warning: RPMDB has been altered since the last yum transaction.
- undo can only work if the packages you want to put BACK on the system are available.
- History commands 'list, summary and info' all take an argument of a package name or glob so you can look up when the last events were that happened to a particular package without having to sift through all of them.

other new items

SSL certificates for authentication to repositories

- yum version: generate a unique identifier for the current installed set of pkgs or a specific set of pkgs. Useful for quickly comparing systems.
- yum downgrade

more other new items

• Createrepo new things:

- Deltarpms
- Arbitrary-url for pkgs
- Mergerepos
- yum-utils:
 - needs-restarting
